Some of you may remember that we took her into Ghar Sita Mutu - House with Heart at just two days old after she was abandoned by her mother. Today, she is well-adjusted and adored by all -- and a tad mischievous as well. She speaks quite a bit of English already and has started nursery school.

We also took in Sujita's four-year-old brother **Dorje** for a six month period. He will then move to the Shangri-la Children's home and join his baby brother, as we no longer will be taking in boys because of government regulations requiring separate housing for boys and girls.
